## Nominations being accepted for Salina Business Hall of Fame

Nominations are being solicited for inductees into the 2015 class of the Salina Business Hall of Fame.

The Chamber established the Hall of Fame in 2005 to honor prominent business leaders both past and present, who have made extraordinary contributions to Salina, earned the respect of the Salina community, and exemplified the Free Enterprise system.

Categories for nominations include:

- **Pioneer Award, 1858-1925**
- **Historic Award, 1926-1975**
- **Contemporary Award, 1976-present**

So far, 34 persons have been inducted into the Business Hall of Fame. Nominations can be made by Chamber members and the general public. Nominees will be considered on the basis of several criteria which include business excellence, entrepreneurial spirit, courageous thinking and action, inspiring leadership, community impact, positive role model, enduring accomplishments and local influence. Individuals nominated in past years will be considered again this year. A special task force will determine the inductees. The inductees will be honored at a luncheon in the fall. A portrait of each inductee will be displayed in the physical Business Hall of Fame, located at the Chamber office.

A nomination form with selection criteria is enclosed. Forms are also available at the Chamber office, 120 W. Ash, and can be downloaded by clicking on "Hall of Fame" on the Chamber's website homepage [www.salinakansas.org](http://www.salinakansas.org). The deadline for nominations is 5pm Friday, July 10.

# Picture Yourself At River Festival 2015!

Young and old can picture themselves having summertime fun at this year's Smoky Hill River Festival, scheduled for Thursday through Sunday, June 11-14 in shady Oakdale Park. For just \$10 (advance) for the weekend (\$15 at the gate), Festival-goers can enjoy four stages of live entertainment and much more.



As one of the most encompassing, all-in-one art celebrations nationally, the River Festival attracts more than 30,000 local and out-of-state guests to browse and shop at the Fine Art and Four Rivers Craft Shows and the Art Demo area that feature more than 130 artists collectively. In addition, 20 outdoor Art Installations integrated into Oakdale Park's natural setting, bordered by the winding Smoky Hill

River, are one of the Festival's most unique features.

The Artyopolis children's area features nine free crafts in Creation Crossing, nine pay-to-play games in the colorful Game Street storefronts, face painting at Paintchoo Plaza, button making and more. Crafts on tap for 2015 include maracas, wind spinners, foam sculptures and sunhats. One special part of Artyopolis that encourages children ages four to 13 to enjoy and select original art is First Treasures, a unique walk-through experience from 11am to 3:30pm on Saturday only, by appointment card.

Thirty-three Festival food vendors, including five first-timers, will tempt appetites each day. New food offerings include shrimp creole or Cajun chicken on a stick, a chicken



cranberry pecan wrap, teriyaki beef ribeye with mashed potatoes, BBQ meatballs and apple nachos with caramel sauce. Each vendor offers at least one food item other than

beverages priced at \$3, to keep things affordable.

On the live music side of things, the River Festival's four stages offer everything from classic rock to jazz to zydeco to acoustic to salsa and more. Headliner acts for Friday and Saturday nights and Sunday afternoon are Steely Dan tribute band Twelve Against Nature, The Band of Heathens, and Bon Ton Soul Accordion Band. Returning acts for 2015 include Beto & The Fairlanes, the David Basse Orchestra and Acoustic Eidolon. National and local performers take the stage on the hour, all accessible with a weekend admission button, with most bleacher and "bring your own lawn-chair" seating in the shade.


